#### Welcome to the 2025-26 School Year!

We hope you had a wonderful summer and are as excited as we are for the 2025–26 school year! You may notice a few changes around the middle school. All back-to-school forms will now be completed online through PowerSchool, and grade-level Welcome Letters can be found here.

Over the summer, our front office and cafeteria received a muchneeded facelift to help ensure the safest possible environment for our students. Due to ongoing construction, we will not be able to host the tentatively scheduled Self-Guided Tour next Monday, but we will be ready for our Open House.

#### **Immunizations Required**

#### for 7th Grade

State law requires that ALL students entering 7<sup>th</sup> grade be up to date on their immunizations in order to attend school.

If you have received a letter, phone call, or email from Mrs.
Champagne, it means your child must either:

- 1. Provide an updated immunization record, or
- 2. Obtain a waiver from the Health Department.

Until the school receives the proper documentation, your child will not be able to attend classes.

Below is a graphic that outlines the expectations. Please remember that all clothing must be school-appropriate. The full dress code policy can be found in the Student Handbook.



#### **After School Study Lab**

Study Lab is available after school Monday through Thursday from 3:15 to 4:15 p.m. in the Media Center. Students are expected to come prepared with their books, homework, and a pencil.

#### Medications

If your student needs to take prescription or non-prescription medication during the school day, a Medication Authorization Form must be completed for each medication. The medication and form must be dropped off at the main office by an adult. A new form is required every school year.



#### **DROP OFF/ PICK UP PROCEDURES**

The parent drop off and pick up procedure is an extremely important process that everyone must abide by. There has been an article in this newsletter for the past several months explaining the procedure, but it is important to review for the safety of all of our children. Parents should drop off and pick up students on the right side of the loop. The left side should be used for moving forward and is a no parking area. If you need to park for an extended time, please use the parking lot. It is also important to not obstruct Northmen Drive. Please see the picture below. The school parking lot is usually extremely busy and congested before and after school, and it will likely be an even greater challenge this year. To help maintain safety and traffic flow, we ask that you use the parent loop and parking lot accordingly. Also, remember that there is an alternate drop off location on the PHS side of Northmen Drive. Students dropped off there can walk to the Middle School through the tunnel. No vehicles other than school buses are allowed in the bus loop. We appreciate your help in keeping our students safe. Also, please do not block Handicap parking spaces!
