Welcome to the 2024-25 School Year!

We hope you have had a great summer and are as excited as we are for the start of the 2024-25 school year! We have been busy preparing a great school year for our students.

Student schedules will be mailed out on August 20. For those who already have accurate PowerSchool login information, student schedules will be available online at that time as well. In addition to your child's schedule, the mailing will include a grade level welcome letter (which is currently available online). An email will be sent with instructions on how to create a PowerSchool login to 6th grade parents and those new to the district. On the first day of school, students will also get a packet during homeroom, which will contain a student verification form that will need to be returned, field trip forms, a picture packet, and other pertinent information. The student verification form is extremely important as this ensures we have correct information to effectively communicate with you as parents.




Attendance

Immunizations

State law requires that ALL students entering 7th grade be up-to-date on their immunizations in order to attend school. If you wish to obtain a waiver, you must get one through the Health Department. If you have any questions, call the Health Department at 347-6014.

Medications

If your student has prescription or non-prescription medicine that they take during the school day, a medication form must be completed for each medication and the medicine dropped off by an adult to the school office. A new form must be filled out each school year.

Food Service - 2024-25 News

Michigan continues to make free breakfast and free lunch an essential part of the school day. The State of Michigan approved funds for Public Schools to continue free meals in Michigan regardless of household income.

What does this mean for the Public Schools of Petoskey? Every student, Pre-K through 12th Grade can receive one (1) free breakfast and one (1) free lunch per school day.

Please take a moment to complete the 100% confidential Education Benefits & Summer EBT Form online at: https://petoskey.familyportal.cloud

OR, complete the attached Education Benefits & Summer EBT Form at the end of this document and return it to your student's building secretary.

The Education Benefits & Summer EBT Form collects information needed to ensure the Public Schools of Petoskey receives state and federal funding for education programs. Without this information, the Public Schools of Petoskey could lose important funding for education programs that our students need. These supplemental grants and programs have the potential to offer supports and services for our students including, but not limited to:

- Instructional Staff
- Teaching Supplies and Materials
- Counselors and Social Workers
- School Nurses
- Professional Learning

Why is the Public Schools of Petoskey requesting financial information? The Education Benefits & Summer EBT Form determines eligibility of a student or household. The total count of eligible students is used to determine the funding amounts that will be made available to a school. The more forms returned the better. The Education Benefits & Summer EBT Form is also used to determine what families will receive EBT Cards. CHARGING GUIDELINES

Elementary School: There will be NO charging of a la carte items, second entrees or milk. We will provide a cup for your child to fill with water if you do not have a drink packed in a lunch brought from home. Middle & High School: There will be NO charging of a la carte items, second entrees or milk. Funds must be on account in order for your child to have a la carte, milk with no lunch or a second meal.

All students, Pre-K through 12 th Grade, will be able to have one (1) free breakfast and one (1) free lunch meal per day.

A milk by itself is NOT a meal. Students must take 3 of the 5 meal components to qualify for the free meals.

IMPORTANT REMINDERS

IMMUNIZATIONS REQUIRED FOR 7TH GRADE

State law requires that ALL students entering 7th grade be up-to-date on their immunizations in order to attend school. If you wish to obtain a waiver, you must get one through the Health Department. Students who are not up-to-date on their immunizations or do not have a waiver will not be allowed to attend school and will be sent home on the first day of the 2024-25 school year. 


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Dress Code Reminder

DROP OFF / PICK UP PROCEDURES

The parent drop off and pick up procedure is an extremely important process that everyone must abide by. There has been an article in this newsletter for the past several months explaining the procedure, but it is important to review for the safety of all of our children. Parents should drop off and pick up students on the right side of the loop. The left side should be used for moving forward and is a no parking area. If you need to park for an extended time, please use the parking lot. It is also important to not obstruct Northmen Drive. Please see the picture below. The school parking lot is usually extremely busy and congested before and after school, and it will likely be an even greater challenge this year. To help maintain safety and traffic flow, we ask that you use the parent loop and parking lot accordingly. Also, remember that there is an alternate drop off location on the PHS side of Northmen Drive. Students dropped off there can walk to the Middle School through the tunnel.

No vehicles other than school buses are allowed in the bus loop. We appreciate your help in keeping our students safe.
